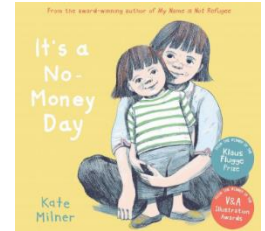


# It's a No Money Day
